Graduate School resources for related topics:

• **Daycare Subsidies** – Graduate students (and undergrads, for that matter) can apply for subsidies through the Child Care Assistance Program and the Student Parent Resource Center (<u>http://www.washington.edu/students/osfa/currentug/child.care.html</u>).
